



Can I transfer my KLM ticket to someone else?

KLM tickets are generally non-transferable. This means once a ticket is issued in your name, it cannot be transferred to another person for security and fare rule reasons. Airline tickets are tied to the identity of the original passenger, and KLM enforces this policy strictly. If you booked your flight directly through KLM.com or their customer service, you'll need to contact them at +1 855-935-5526 to explore your options. If your booking was made through a travel agency, reach out to them directly.

In general, changing the name to another person's is not allowed, but minor name corrections (like fixing typos) for the original passenger may be permitted. These corrections are often free of charge, especially if addressed early.

Some fare types, such as Standard or Flex, may allow other types of changes (like date or route), but name transfers are not part of that flexibility. If a transfer isn't possible, your best option might be to cancel the ticket—keeping in mind that cancellation fees may apply—and then purchase a new ticket for the other person. Reward tickets booked through Flying Blue may be used for others, but standard tickets must remain in the original passenger's name.
