## 7. Perform a Clean Boot

Press Windows + R, type msconfig, and hit Enter.

Go to the Services tab and check Hide all Microsoft services, then click Disable all.

Go to the Startup[/b] tab and click Open Task Manager[/b]. Disable all startup programs.

Restart your PC and launch QuickBooks.

## 8. Update Windows 11

Ensure that your Windows 11 system is up-to-date with the latest patches:

Press Windows + I[/b] to open Settings.

Go to Windows Update[/b] and click Check for updates[/b].

Install any pending updates and restart your computer.

## 9. Reinstall QuickBooks

Backup your company files.
